**DECLARATION OF HENRY JACOBI IN SUPPORT OF DEBTOR'S

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CHAPTER 11 CASE MANAGEMENT SUMMARY

The Stephan Co. (the “**Debtor**”), by and through undersigned proposed counsel and pursuant to Rule 2081-1 of the Local Rules of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Florida (the “**Local Rules**”), files this Case Management Summary, stating as follows:

BACKGROUND

1. Contemporaneously with the filing hereof (the “**Petition Date**”), the Debtor commenced with this Court a case under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the “**Bankruptcy Code**” and the case commenced thereunder, the “**Chapter 11 Case**”). The Debtor is operating its business as debtor-in-possession pursuant to sections 1107 and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code. No trustee, examiner, or official committee has been appointed. The goal of the chapter 11 filing is the confirmation of a plan incorporating a section 524(g) trust and accompanying supplemental channeling injunction with the full cooperation of the Debtor’s creditors, including holders of talc-related tort claims, and other stakeholders.

A. Description of the Debtor's Business and Reason for Filing Chapter 11

(a) The Debtor's Origins

2. The Debtor is the holding company for three operating company subsidiaries (the Current Subsidiaries as defined below, and collectively with the Debtor, predecessors and preexisting subsidiaries, the "**Stephan Group**") in the business of manufacturing and distributing barber, beauty, and personal care products throughout the United States and select markets overseas. The Debtor's predecessor was founded in Worcester, Massachusetts in 1892, producing barber equipment and surgical tools. The company was recognized as the first men's hair care company in the United States and by 1920 was generating annual revenues of \$5 million. In 1952, the Debtor incorporated as a Florida corporation and moved its headquarters to Fort Lauderdale, merging with its predecessor in the process. By that time, the Debtor had manufacturing facilities located across the country and focused on the sale of barber shop hair tonics and shampoos. In 1960, the Debtor went public for the first time. However, cultural shifts disfavoring barbershops led to the company being delisted from the stock exchange shortly thereafter. (As discussed below, the Debtor's shares are currently traded on the so-called Pink Sheets (as defined below) market.)

(b) Mergers and Acquisitions

3. Starting in the 1980s, the Debtor came under new ownership and leadership. To leverage underutilized manufacturing capacity, its new leadership entered into private label manufacturing agreements, eventually producing products for large retailers, including K-Mart Corp. As a result of these manufacturing agreements, the Stephan Group gained economic strength and liquidity and explored additional growth opportunities through acquisition, targeting profitable brands that were small enough to escape the attention of major companies and either had a niche in the marketplace or were once high-selling brands with the prospect of reinvigoration.

4. One such transaction was the 1988 acquisition of Old 97 Company (“**Old 97**”), a Tampa, Florida-based company that manufactured a wide range of cosmetics, toiletries, and household products sold door-to-door in smaller markets in the South. Old 97 also engaged in private label manufacturing, producing hair and skin care products for certain national brands, including Gold Bond Co. Inc. (“**Gold Bond**”). Following the acquisition, and until the merger described below, Old 97 was a wholly owned subsidiary of the Debtor.

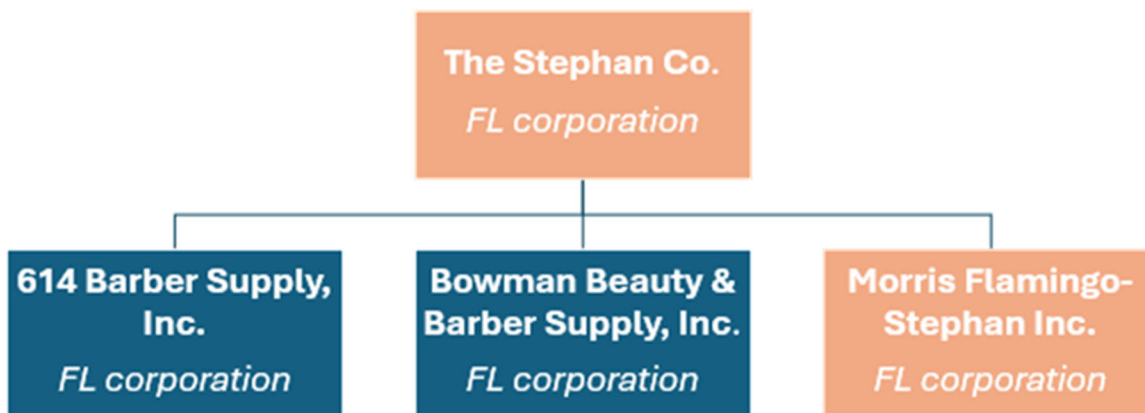
5. Starting in around 1994, and as a result of its growth, the Debtor’s stock again traded on the American Stock Exchange, and by 1997, after a string of successful acquisitions and deals with leading drug stores, supermarkets, and retailers including Sears, Roebuck and JC Penny, the Stephan Group reported net sales of \$27 million and net income of \$5 million.

6. However, after reaching peak revenues in 1998, economic shifts resulted in declining revenues for the Stephan Group’s professional and manufacturing business segments. In 2009, the Debtor delisted its stock from the American Stock Exchange and deregistered its common stock. The Debtor then listed its stock on the OTC Pink market (“**Pink Sheets**”).

7. By 2015, the Debtor directly or indirectly owned twelve subsidiaries, and decided to slim down its corporate family to eliminate unnecessary or dormant entities through mergers by and between the Debtor and its subsidiaries. Having long since ceased the manufacture and distribution of Gold Bond and any other talc products, Old 97 was one such dormant entity. In 2016, several subsidiaries including Old 97 were merged into the Debtor.

8. Despite market challenges associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, the Stephan Group continued to grow steadily through the early 2020s, including through acquisition and subsequent additional mergers within and between the Debtor and its subsidiaries. As a result of these restructuring efforts, the Debtor now has sole ownership interests in three subsidiaries: 614

Barber Supply, Inc. (“**614**”), Bowman Beauty & Barber Supply, Inc. (“**Bowman Beauty**”), and Morris Flamingo-Stephan, Inc. (“**Morris Flamingo**” and collectively, the “**Current Subsidiaries**”). The Current Subsidiaries are not debtors in the Chapter 11 Case. A summary of the Debtor’s current corporate structure is as follows:



9. In 2023, the Debtor and the Current Subsidiaries reported an aggregate annual revenue of \$10,582,000 and gross profit of \$2,648,000, and in 2024, an aggregate annual revenue of \$9,959,000 and gross profit of \$2,866,000. Their consolidated 2025 balance sheet is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. In 2025, the Debtor independently has not reported any revenue and has recorded a net loss, to date, of \$352,000. The Debtor and its Current Subsidiaries collectively employ around 25 part- and full-time individuals.

(c) Talc Litigation

10. As previously mentioned, Old 97 served as a contract manufacturer for Gold Bond products and produced talc products under the Gold Bond label, as well as a talc product marketed under the trade name “Cashmere Bouquet.” Old 97 ceased manufacturing Gold Bond and any other talc products before the Debtor merged with Old 97 in 2016. At the time of the merger, the Debtor was unaware of any potential Talc Personal Injury Claims.

11. In 2019, the Debtor, only as an alleged successor in liability to Old 97, was first named as a defendant in talc personal injury lawsuits (the “**Talc Lawsuits**”) alleging personal injuries caused by exposure to products containing talc allegedly contaminated with asbestos, such talc products being previously manufactured and/or sold by Old 97 (the “**Talc Personal Injury Claims**”). The number of Talc Lawsuits naming the Debtor has since increased dramatically, rising to over 700 Talc Lawsuits, over 500 of which are active and pending as of the Petition Date. Approximately 200 cases were dismissed upon the Debtor’s motion and 15 were settled. The Debtor has teams of defense counsel in at least 10 states to manage Talc Lawsuits.

12. The Debtor has not yet been found liable in any Talc Lawsuit but has settled 15 cases. To date, the Debtor’s liabilities and costs under the Talc Lawsuits have been primarily covered by its insurers, Fireman’s Fund Insurance Company (“**FFIC**”) and Liberty Mutual Insurance Company (“**Liberty**” and with FFIC, the “**Insurers**”). The Debtor cannot reliably estimate the costs associated with litigating and settling the remaining Talc Lawsuits, but the projected amount is easily in the tens of millions, if not more. As noted, at the present rate of exploding litigation, the current insurance coverage will eventually (and in the relative near-term) be exhausted by settlements reached or judgments obtained in a relatively small number of cases compared to the hundreds of pending cases. The Debtor further expects that, once its indemnity insurance coverage is exhausted and funding for the costs of defense by FFIC and Liberty also ceases, its existing assets will be insufficient to cover even a fraction of such liabilities.

13. While the Debtor believes that the Talc Personal Injury Claims are without merit and that all talc historically manufactured by the Debtor or Old 97 was safe, the Debtor faces significant potential liability and expense resulting from the increasing number of Talc Lawsuits. Continuing to defend the litigation in the tort system is not a sustainable proposition.

(d) Reason for Filing Chapter 11

14. The purpose of the Chapter 11 Case is to address and comprehensively resolve the Debtor's present and future talc-related personal injury liabilities. The Debtor's decision to commence the Chapter 11 Case, therefore, was prompted by the growing number of Talc Lawsuits, coupled with: (i) increased settlement demands with respect to pending Talc Personal Injury Claims; (ii) the anticipated projected future Talc Personal Injury Claims; and (iii) based on investigations to date, the limited availability of insurance coverage (if any) for the defense and/or resolution of the remaining and future Talc Lawsuits.

15. As a result of the growing volume of litigation resulting in the increasing incurrence of defense costs and increasing settlement amounts, coupled with the limited availability of insurance coverage (if any) for the defense and/or resolution of Talc Personal Injury Claims (based on investigation to date), the Debtor determined that the commencement of the Chapter 11 Case and a policy buyback incorporated into a plan of reorganization is the best option to protect the Debtor's estate and preserve value for all stakeholders. The Debtor lacks the financial wherewithal to remain in the tort system, and the proposed recoveries for Talc Personal Injury Claims under a 524(g) plan significantly exceed the alternative, which would be the liquidation of the Debtor (and potentially the Current Subsidiaries), whether through Chapter 7 or a state law proceeding.

(e) Prepetition Negotiations, Settlement and Policy Buybacks, and Ongoing Plan Discussions

16. As a result of the mushrooming level of asserted Talc Personal Injury Claims and the unsustainable litigation and growing settlement costs, the Debtor retained bankruptcy counsel (Verrill Dana LLP) and a financial advisor (Getzler Henrich & Associates LLC) in mid- to late 2025 to begin evaluating strategic options to resolve the Debtor's talc-related personal injury liabilities.

17. At the same time, the Debtor began exploring, among other options, the viability of using bankruptcy to address the present and future Talc Personal Injury Claims by channeling the claims to a trust created under sections 105 and 524(g)² of the Bankruptcy Code that would be structured to ensure fair and equitable treatment of present and future claimants.

18. Following settlement discussions from September 2025 through November 2025 between and among the parties, the Debtor and FFIC reached a settlement agreement (the “**FFIC Settlement Agreement**”) which provides, among other things, for FFIC to buy back all of its relevant insurance policies in exchange for receiving releases under a plan of reorganization. The FFIC Settlement Agreement is discussed in greater detail below. The bulk of the proceeds from the policy buy-back would be contributed to the proposed section 524(g) trust.

19. Prior to seeking bankruptcy relief, the Debtor also contacted the counsel (the “**Talc Plaintiffs’ Counsel**”) representing the largest numbers of individuals asserting Talc Personal Injury Claims (the “**Talc Personal Injury Claimants**”) and engaged in preliminary discussions with Talc Plaintiffs’ Counsel to propose the formation of an ad hoc prepetition committee of Talc Personal Injury Claimants (the “**Prepetition Talc Claimants’ Committee**”) and open discussions regarding a possible consensual chapter 11 plan incorporating a trust and supplemental channeling injunction in accordance with section 524(g) of the Bankruptcy Code. Talc Plaintiffs’ Counsel subsequently formed the Prepetition Talc Claimants’ Committee and retained Caplin & Drysdale as counsel. After the committee members signed non-disclosure agreements, the Pre-petition Talc

² Section 524(g) of the Bankruptcy Code contemplates the creation of a trust to “assume the liabilities of a debtor which at the time of entry of the order for relief has been named as a defendant in personal injury, wrongful death, or property- damage actions seeking recovery for damages allegedly caused by the presence of, or exposure to, asbestos or asbestos-containing products.” 11 U.S.C. § 524(g)(2)(B)(i)(I). Section 524(g) further provides for a “channeling” injunction that directs all present and future asbestos-related “demands” to the trust for liquidation and satisfaction of allowed amounts. 11 U.S.C. § 524(g)(1).

Claimants' Committee received various confidential documents and detailed information from the Debtor in response to information requests from the committee. Preliminary discussions were held regarding the proposed plan and section 524(g) trust. The Debtor expects that the Prepetition Talc Claimants' Committee will likely become an official committee now that the petition has been filed and that such discussions will continue in furtherance of a fully-consensual plan.

B. Location of the Debtor's Operations and Whether Leased or Owned

20. The Debtor is a Florida corporation and the Debtor's registered office is located at 7901 4th Street N, Suite 300, St. Petersburg, Florida 33702. The Debtor and most of its subsidiaries operate out of a leased 26,456 square foot facility located at 2211 Reach Road, Suite B4, Williamsport, Pennsylvania 17701 to meet the operational demands of the businesses.

C. List of Officers, Directors, and Insiders and Their Salaries and Benefits

21. Jad Fakhry is a director of the Debtor and owns approximately 37%^{3,4} of shares in the Debtor.

22. Joel Getz is a director of the Debtor and serves as its secretary. Mr. Getz owns approximately 1% of shares in the Debtor.

23. Brian Harper serves as Chairman of the Board of Directors and owns approximately 13%⁵ of shares in the Debtor.

24. Each director receives shares in the Debtor in exchange for their respective service on the Board of Directors, pursuant to the Directors Incentive Share Plan adopted by the Debtor in

2018. Additionally, each director receives a monthly director fee of \$2,000⁶ for services performed as director to the Debtor. The directors do not receive any other benefits from the Debtor.

25. Henry Jacobi serves as the Debtor's Chief Executive Officer, as well as the President and Treasurer of the Current Subsidiaries. Mr. Jacobi is paid an annual salary by the Debtor's subsidiary, Morris Flamingo, with an option for an additional annual bonus. Mr. Jacobi receives the following benefits: a monthly housing stipend of \$1,200, personal medical, dental, life and long-term disability insurance, and 50% medical insurance coverage for children. Mr. Jacobi also is awarded equity interests in the Debtor on an annual basis and currently holds less than 1% of the shares in the Debtor.

D. Debtor's Annual Gross Revenues

26. In 2024, the Debtor individually reported no revenue or profit and a net loss in income of \$146,000.

27. For the year to date in 2025, the Debtor individually has reported no revenue or profits and a net loss of \$352,000.

E. Amounts Owed to Various Creditors, Including Current Year to Date and Prior Fiscal Year

28. As of the Petition Date, the Debtor believes it is indebted to various creditors as follows:

(a) *Priority Creditors*

29. The Debtor believes it does not have any priority creditors. The Debtor believes it is current with respect to all state tax obligations. The Debtor has not yet filed their 2024 federal tax returns. However, given its financials (discussed herein), the Debtor does not anticipate a

payment being due to the Internal Revenue Service upon filing of its 2024 returns. Therefore, the Debtor believes it does not hold any debts subject to priority treatment.

(b) Secured Creditors and Their Respective Collateral

30. The Debtor serves as a guarantor for two separate loans, each between one of its subsidiaries and M&T Bank. The Debtor's guarantees are secured by all of its money, securities, and other property in actual or constructive possession or control of M&T Bank and its affiliates. The following is a summary of the M&T Bank loans for which the Debtor serves as guarantor:

As of the Petition Date, the loans are not in default.

Additionally, in order to fund retainers for its professionals in connection with this Chapter 11 Case, the Debtor entered into an Intercompany Transaction (as defined below) in the form of an Intercompany Note with Bowman Beauty dated November 26, 2025 (the “**Intercompany Note**”). Pursuant to the Intercompany Note, Bowman Beauty loaned to the Debtor \$565,947.00, subject to interest, to fund the requisite retainers. The Intercompany Note matures on its first (1st) anniversary.

(c) Unsecured Creditors (Other than Talc Personal Injury Claims)

31. The Debtor estimates general unsecured claims of \$442,287.53, representing the amounts the Debtor guaranteed on the M&T Bank loans to the extent they are not secured by all of the Debtor's money, securities, and other property in actual or constructive possession or control of M&T Bank and its affiliates.

(d) Talc Personal Injury Claims

32. Attached hereto as **Exhibit B** is a list of the Debtor's current Talc Lawsuits.

F. General Description and Approximate Value of the Debtor's Current and Fixed Assets

33. See **Exhibit A**.

G. Number of Employees and Gross Amounts of Wages Owed as of the Petition Date

34. The Debtor does not have any employees and therefore owes no wages as of the Petition Date. The Current Subsidiaries employ all employees of the Stephan Group.

H. Status of the Debtor's Payroll and Tax Obligations

35. As stated above, the Debtor does not retain a workforce and therefore is not subject to any payroll obligations. The Debtor is current on all state tax obligations but has yet to file its 2024 federal tax returns. The Debtor anticipates doing so shortly after commencing this Chapter 11 Case.

FIRST DAY PLEADINGS⁸

36. Contemporaneously herewith, the Debtor has filed first day pleadings (the "**First Day Pleadings**") seeking orders granting various forms of relief intended to stabilize the Debtor's business operations, facilitate the efficient administration of the Chapter 11 Case, and expedite a smooth reorganization. The First Day Pleadings include the following:

- (i) *Debtor's Application Authorizing Retention and Employment of Kroll Restructuring Administration LLC as Claims, Noticing, and Solicitation Agent Effective as of the Petition Date* (the "**Noticing Agent Application**")
- (ii) *Debtor's Emergency Motion for Entry of Interim and Final Orders (I) Authorizing the Filing of a List of (A) the Law Firms Representing the Largest Numbers of Talc Claims Against the Debtor, (II) Authorizing the Listing of Addresses of Counsel for Talc Asbestos Claimants in Creditor*

*Matrix in Lieu of Claimants' Addresses, (III) Approving Notice Procedures for Such Claimants, and (IV) Granting Related Relief (the "**Noticing Procedures Motion**")*

- (iii) *Debtor's Emergency Motion for Entry of an Order Authorizing Debtor to (I) Continue Insurance Programs and Honor Certain Prepetition Obligations in Respect Thereof; (II) Renew, Revise, Extend, Supplement, Change or Enter into New Insurance Coverage as Needed in Its Business Judgment (the "**Insurance Motion**")*
- (iv) *Debtor's Emergency Motion for Entry of Interim and Final Orders (I) Authorizing the Debtor to (A) Maintain Its Cash Management System and Existing Bank Accounts, (B) Honor Certain Prepetition Obligations Related Thereto, (C) Maintain Existing Business Forms, and (D) Perform Intercompany Transactions; and (II) Granting Related Relief (the "**Cash Management Motion**")*

37. As described in detail below, the First Day Pleadings seek authority to, among other things, ensure the continuation of the Debtor's cash management system and other operations in the ordinary course of business.

38. Rule 6003 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure provides, in relevant part, that the Court shall not consider motions to "use . . . property of the estate, including a motion to pay all or a part of a claim that arose before the petition was filed" or "incur any other obligation regarding the property of the estate" within the first 21 days after a bankruptcy petition is filed. Fed. R. Bankr. P. 6003(a)(2) and (3). To the extent applicable, the Debtor has narrowly tailored their requests for immediate authority to use or incur obligations regarding property of the estate to those circumstances in which failure to do so would cause immediate and irreparable harm to the Debtor and its estate.

39. The Debtor believes approval of the relief sought in each of the First Day Pleadings is critical to its ability to utilize chapter 11 successfully to implement a value-maximizing reorganization, with minimal disruption to their business operations.

A. Noticing Agent Application

40. By the Noticing Agent Application, the Debtor seeks entry of an order authorizing it to employ and retain Kroll Restructuring Administration LLC (“**Kroll**”) as the Debtor’s claims, noticing, and solicitation agent in connection with the Chapter 11 Case effective as of the Petition Date. The Debtor believes that the distribution of notices and the processing of claims will be expedited by Kroll’s retention, and the Office of the Clerk of Court will be relieved of the related administrative burden. Furthermore, the attendant cost of maintaining the Debtor’s service list and effectuating proper service of all pleadings filed by the Debtor is substantially lessened by retaining a professional noticing agent (rather than requesting the Debtor’s proposed counsel handle noticing). As such, the Debtor believes retention of Kroll is necessary, appropriate, and in the best interest of the Debtor’s estate.

B. Noticing Procedures Motion

41. Pursuant to the Noticing Procedures Motion, the Debtor requests authority from the Court to (i) file the Talc Personal Injury Counsel List, consisting of a list of the law firms representing the largest numbers known holders of presently pending Talc Personal Injury Claims, in lieu of a list of the holders of the twenty largest unsecured claims against the Debtor, (ii) list the addresses of known counsel of record for such holders of Talc Personal Injury Claims asserting claims against the Debtor, in lieu of the addresses of the claimants themselves, on the Debtor’s creditor matrix, and (iii) implement a procedure by which the Debtor’s claims and noticing agent approved by the Court (the “**Claims and Noticing Agent**”) shall send required notices, mailings and other communications related to the Chapter 11 Case to such counsel of record for presently known Talc Personal Injury Claimants in lieu of sending such communications to the claimants themselves.

42. As detailed above and in the Noticing Procedures Motion, hundreds of talc personal injury claims have alleged that the Debtor is liable for damages allegedly caused by exposure to talc that was manufactured by an entity later acquired by the Debtor. As of October 9, 2025, there were approximately 526 pending Talc Lawsuits against the Debtor. The Talc Personal Injury Counsel List is based on the number of open and active Talc Personal Injury Claims. Nearly all of the Debtor's known contingent creditors are holders of Talc Personal Injury Claims.

43. Because nearly all the holders of present Talc Personal Injury Claims assert unliquidated claims against the Debtor, it would be impossible to determine which holders have the largest unsecured claims in the Chapter 11 Case. It is rare for holders of Talc Personal Injury Claims to assert specific damages amounts in their complaints, and thus there is no means for the Debtor to accurately determine which of the known Talc Personal Injury Claims are the largest.

44. In addition, the Debtor does not have the information necessary to populate a Top Twenty List with the personal information of the Talc Personal Injury Claimants, rather than the law firms representing such claimants. Accordingly, the Debtor seeks authority to file the Top Talc Personal Injury Counsel List in lieu of a Top Twenty List that includes individual talc claimants.

45. Considering the nature of the Debtor's case, and that the proposed Plan, if confirmed, will leave non-talc unsecured creditors unimpaired, the Debtor anticipates that the U.S. Trustee will appoint, post-petition, an official committee of talc personal injury claimants (a "**Talc Claimants Committee**"), in lieu of an official committee of unsecured trade creditors. The Talc Claimants Committee would consist of individuals that are representative of the Debtor's pool of talc personal injury claimants represented by firms serving on the Talc Claimants Committee.

46. The Debtor believes that it is in the best interests of its estate and creditors, and most helpful to the U.S. Trustee, to produce a Top Talc Personal Injury Counsel List instead of a Top Twenty List.

C. Insurance Motion

47. Pursuant to the Insurance Motion, the Debtor seeks authority to (a) maintain the existing Insurance Policies and pay the Insurance Obligations arising therefrom in the ordinary course of business; (b) renew, revise, extend, supplement, change, or enter into new insurance policies as needed in its business judgment; and (c) continue to honor their Premium Financing Obligations. The Debtor also requests that the Court: (i) authorize and direct any and all banks with which the Debtor maintains accounts that the Debtor use to make payments related to the Insurance Policies, Insurance Obligations, and Premium Financing Obligations to receive, process, honor and pay all checks drawn on such accounts and fund transfers for payments with respect to the Insurance Policies, Insurance Obligations, and Premium Financing Obligations, whether presented before or after the Petition Date, provided that sufficient funds are on deposit in the applicable accounts to cover such payments; and (ii) authorize the Debtor to issue new postpetition checks or effect new postpetition fund transfers on account of the Insurance Policies, Insurance Obligations, and Premium Financing Obligations and to replace any prepetition checks or fund transfer requests that may be dishonored or rejected.

48. In the ordinary course of its business operations, the Debtor maintains insurance policies providing coverage for, among others, general liability, director and officer liability, workers' compensation liability, commercial liability, marine cargo liability, cyber risk liability, and medical, vision, and dental coverage—for itself and for its non-debtor subsidiaries (the “**Insurance Policies**”). For the policy period of 2025 to 2026, the Debtor anticipates total premiums under the Insurance Policies to be approximately \$152,000. The Insurance Policies,

which the Debtor has obtained through third-party insurance carriers (collectively, the “**Insurance Carriers**”), are listed and attached to the Insurance Motion as Exhibit C.⁹ In connection with the Insurance Policies, the Debtor pays certain obligations, including premiums, deductibles and administration fees (collectively, the “**Insurance Obligations**”).

49. The Insurance Policies are essential to preserving the value of the Debtor’s business, property and assets, and essential to its non-debtor subsidiaries’ businesses. Much of the coverage provided by the Insurance Policies are required by regulations, laws and contracts that govern the Debtor’s commercial activities. Maintenance of insurance coverage under the various Insurance Policies on an uninterrupted basis is essential to the continued operation of the Debtor’s business and, in many cases, is required under the United States Trustee’s Operating Guidelines for Chapter 11 Cases (the “**Operating Guidelines**”). The Debtor’s failure to pay liabilities related to the Insurance Obligations could result in the termination or cancellation of the Insurance Policies, which in turn would cause significant disruption and distraction to the Debtor’s estates (and the businesses of its non-debtor subsidiaries).

50. The premium due under the Insurance Policy for director and officer liability coverage (the “**D&O Policy**”) was financed through IPFS Corporation (“**IPFS**”) pursuant to a premium financing agreement with the Debtor (the “**PFA**”), which is attached to the Insurance Motion as Exhibit D. Under the PFA, the Debtor made a cash down payment of \$10,009.00 and is required to make eleven (11) monthly payments of \$2,846.69, with the first payment being due on December 18, 2025 and the final payment coming due on October 18, 2026 (collectively, the

“Premium Financing Obligations”), on account of the D&O Policy premium and finance charges. The obligations under the PFA are secured by a security interest in all right, title and interest in the D&O Policy, including any unearned premium under the policy.

51. The Debtor requests authority to pay any Premium Financing Obligations that may be determined to be owed either for the pre- or postpetition period, as the Debtor’s failure to pay such obligations could result in the termination of the D&O Policy financed through the PFA, which in turn would cause significant disruption and distraction to the Debtor’s estate. The Debtor also seeks authority to pay future Premium Financing Obligations under the PFA in the ordinary course of business for similar reasons. Finally, the Debtor further seeks authority to renew or enter into new premium financing arrangements if necessary.

D. Cash Management Motion

52. Pursuant to the Debtor’s Cash Management Motion, it seeks an order, on interim and then final basis, (i) authorizing the Debtor to (a) maintain the Cash Management System (as defined herein), and existing Bank Accounts at the Banks (as defined herein), (b) honor certain prepetition obligations related thereto, (c) maintain existing Business Forms (as defined herein), and (d) perform Intercompany Transactions (as defined herein) consistent with past practices; and (ii) granting related relief.

53. In the ordinary course of its business, the Debtor maintains an integrated, centralized cash management system (the **“Cash Management System”**) with its non-debtor subsidiaries (the **“Non-Debtor Subsidiaries”**, and, collectively with the Debtor, the **“Stephan Group”**). The Debtor uses the Cash Management System in the ordinary course of its business to collect, transfer, and disburse funds generated from the operations of it and its subsidiaries and to facilitate cash monitoring, forecasting, and reporting (as part of the Intercompany Transactions, defined and described below). The Stephan Group’s chief financial officer and finance department

maintain daily oversight of the Cash Management System and utilizes cash management controls for entering, processing, and releasing funds.

54. As of the Petition Date, the Debtor's Cash Management System was composed of the following bank accounts¹⁰ (each financial institution, a "**Bank**" and each account, a "**Bank Account**", and collectively, the "**Banks**" and the "**Bank Accounts**"):

55. The Debtor's checking account is funded manually; there are no direct deposits from revenue going into that account. Any payments withdrawn from the checking account are related directly to the Debtor's expenses. The Debtor's sweep account is a M&T Bank Cash Account ("**MCA**") program offered through LPL Financial LLC. Under the MCA program, available cash balances will automatically transfer (or "sweep") into interest-bearing Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("**FDIC**") insured deposit accounts at M&T Bank. The balance in that account will sweep out at the end of each day and sweep back into the account at the beginning of each day. The Debtor's non-debtor subsidiaries will fund the Debtor's checking account when needed to cover the expenses relating to insurance, legal fees, or other expenses directly paid by the Debtor but shared by the Stephan Group. The Debtor's investment account was funded several years ago and is designated to be used for stock repurchases.

56. The *Operating Guidelines and Reporting Requirements for Debtors in Possession and Trustees* (the "**U.S. Trustee Guidelines**") generally require chapter 11 debtors to, among other things, deposit all estate funds into an account with an authorized depository that agrees to comply

with the requirements of the Office of the United States Trustee (the “**U.S. Trustee**”). As described above, the Cash Management System is complex and critical to the ongoing stability of the Debtor’s business and transition into chapter 11 and is intertwined with the bank accounts of its non-debtor subsidiaries. Requiring the Debtor to transfer the Bank Accounts to a designated authorized depository would place a needless and excessive administrative burden on the Debtor and impose significant, value-destructive costs on the Debtor. Given the importance of the Cash Management System and the Bank Accounts, such a transfer would likely require time and resources, all to the detriment of the Debtor at the outset of this Chapter 11 Case. Accordingly, the Debtor respectfully requests that the Court grant the relief requested herein, first on an interim basis and then, after adequate notice and final hearing, on a final basis.

57. As part of the Cash Management System, the Debtor utilizes various business forms in the ordinary course of business, including letterhead, checks, correspondence forms, invoices, and other business forms (all business forms used by the Debtor hereinafter collectively referred to as, the “**Business Forms**”). The Debtor also maintains books and records to document, among other things, its profits and expenses. To minimize unnecessary additional costs to the Debtor, the Debtor requests that the Court authorize its continued use of the Business Forms, as all such forms were in existence immediately before the Petition Date, without reference to the Debtor’s status as debtor in possession, rather than requiring the Debtor to incur the unnecessary expense, administrative burden, and delay of ordering entirely new forms as required under the U.S. Trustee Guidelines. Once the Debtor has exhausted its existing supply of Business Forms, it will reorder Business Forms with the designation “Debtor in Possession” and the bankruptcy case number on all such forms.

58. The Debtor incurs periodic service charges and other fees in connection with the maintenance of the Cash Management System (collectively, the “**Bank Fees**”), which Bank Fees are generally paid each month. The Bank Fees are comprised of merchant services fees, receipt transaction processing fees, disbursement transaction processing fees, and account maintenance fees. As of the Petition Date, the Debtor estimates that certain routine and customary Bank Fees were owed to the Banks where the Bank Accounts are maintained. The Debtor seeks permission to pay these Bank Fees and continue paying the Bank Fees on a postpetition basis consistent with past practice.

59. As stated above, the Debtor and the Non-Debtor Subsidiaries engage in ordinary course intercompany transactions (the “**Intercompany Transactions**”) to manage day-to-day operations and expenses between the companies that comprise the Stephan Group. The Intercompany Transactions are either reflected as intercompany receivables and payables or as intercompany notes or loans. At any given time, there may be balances owing between the Debtor and the Non-Debtor Subsidiaries. The Debtor also benefits significantly from the receipt of incoming cash from profitable Non-Debtor Subsidiaries. The Debtor and the Non-Debtor Subsidiaries track the Intercompany Transactions, which occur as a part of the daily operation of the Cash Management System. The continuance of the Intercompany Transactions is essential to support the Debtor’s operations and the operations of the Non-Debtor Subsidiaries. Accordingly, the Debtor requests authority to continue the Intercompany Transactions in the ordinary course.
